Convenient Deadlines

In addition to expanding the convenience of location when voting, the new law relaxes the deadlines for registering to vote as well as for voting by mail. If you are not registered to vote, you may now register up to 15 days before the election. Additionally, you may now request an absentee or mail-in ballot up to 50 days before an election (previously only 30 days). Once complete, the ballot must be returned to your county voter registration office no later than 8 pm on Election Day. This change was much needed; had this change been permitted in 2018, 8,000 more votes would have been counted in the general election.
